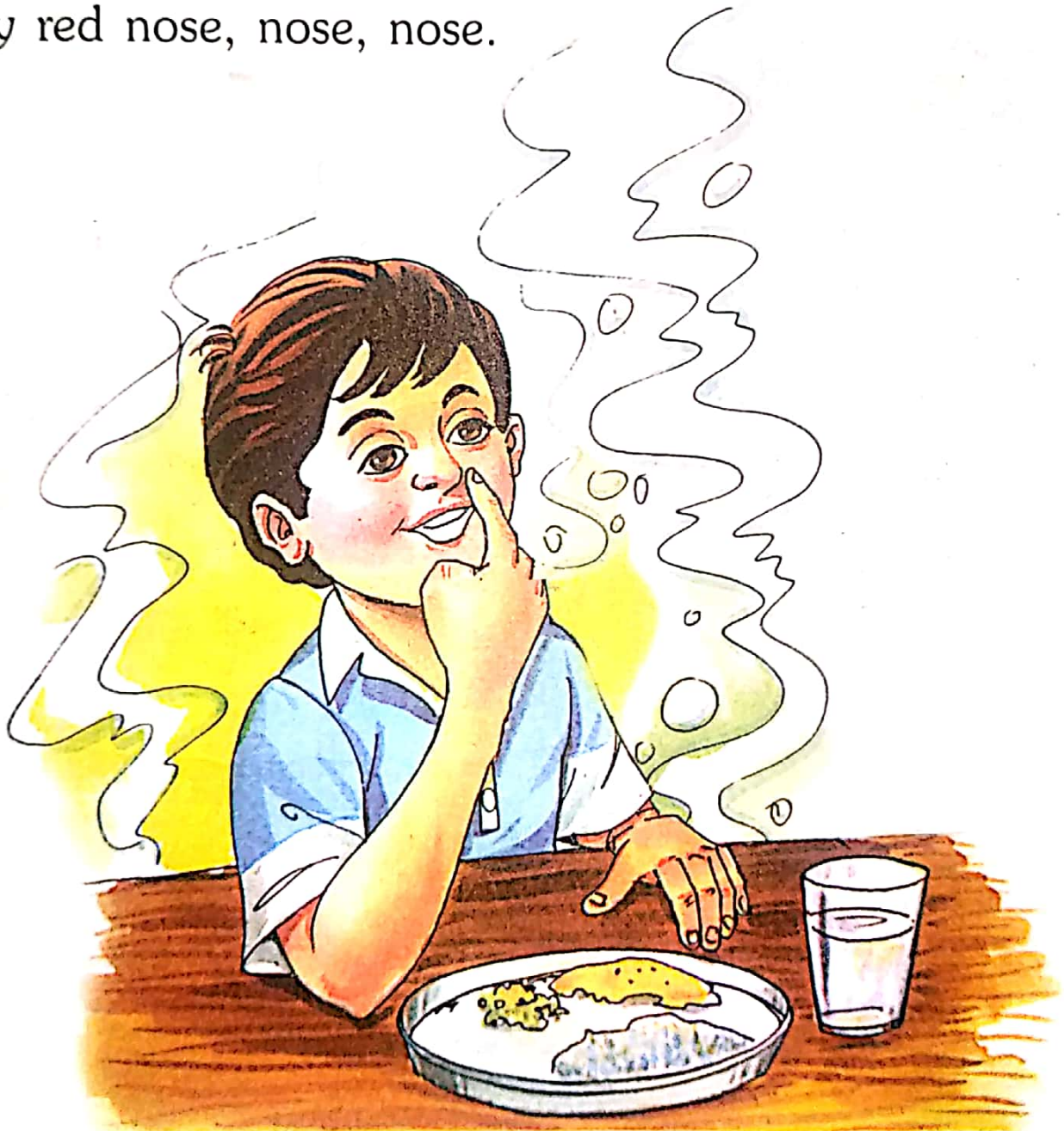


JOLLY RED NOSE

Hey Jingle bells! Jingle bells!



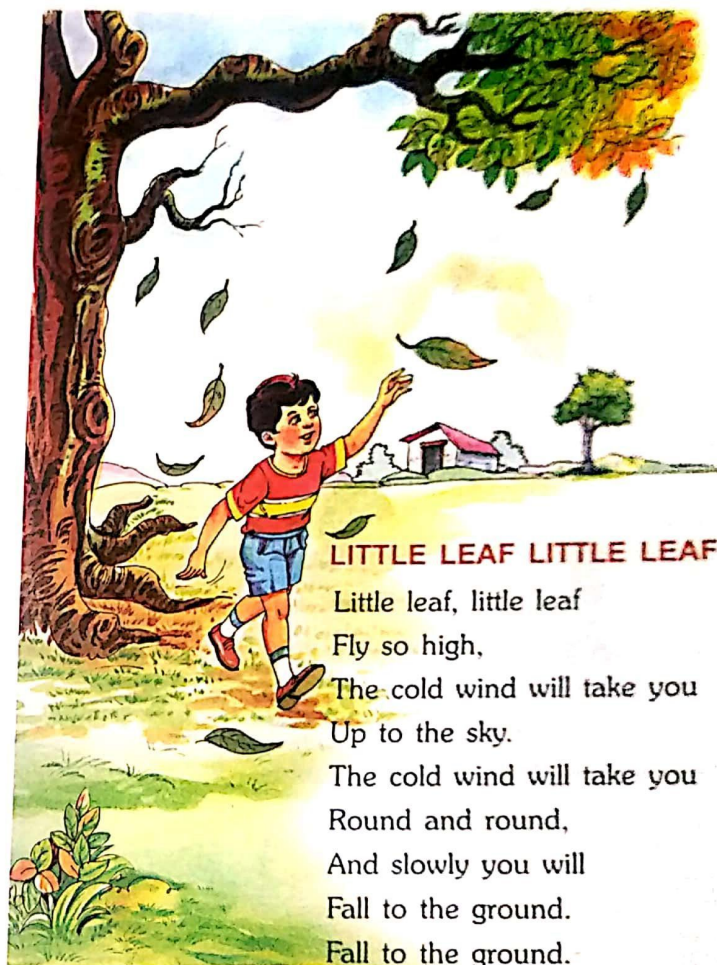
Dashing through the snow,

Hey Jingle bells! Jingle bells!



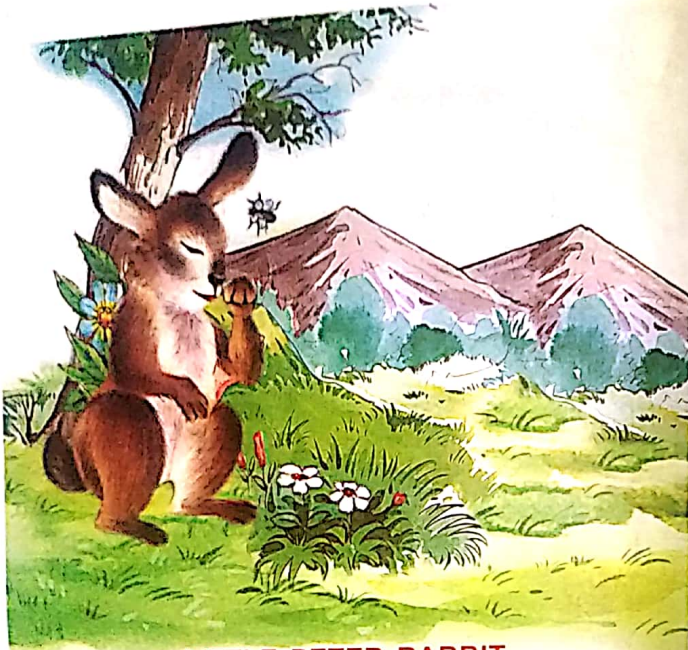
LITTLE BO-PEEP

 And he flicked it and flew away.

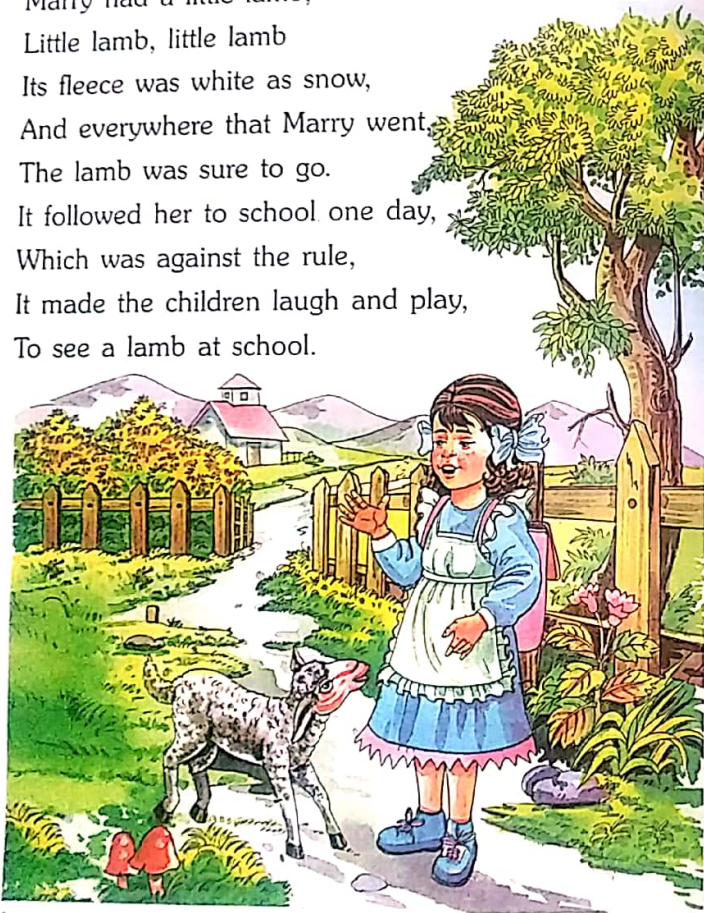


LONDON BRIDGE

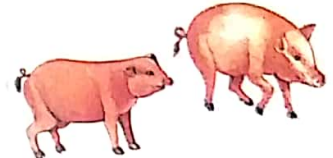

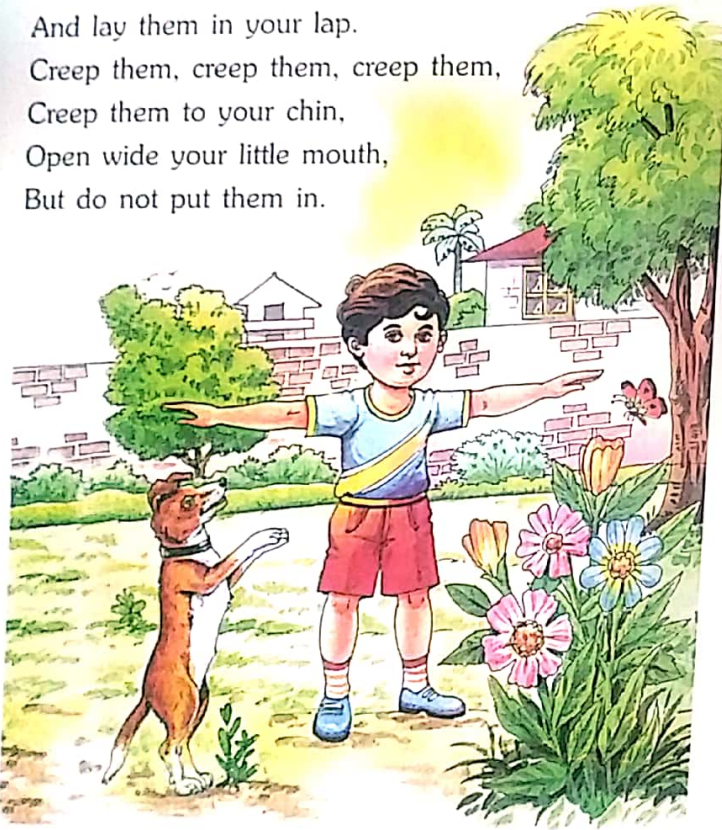

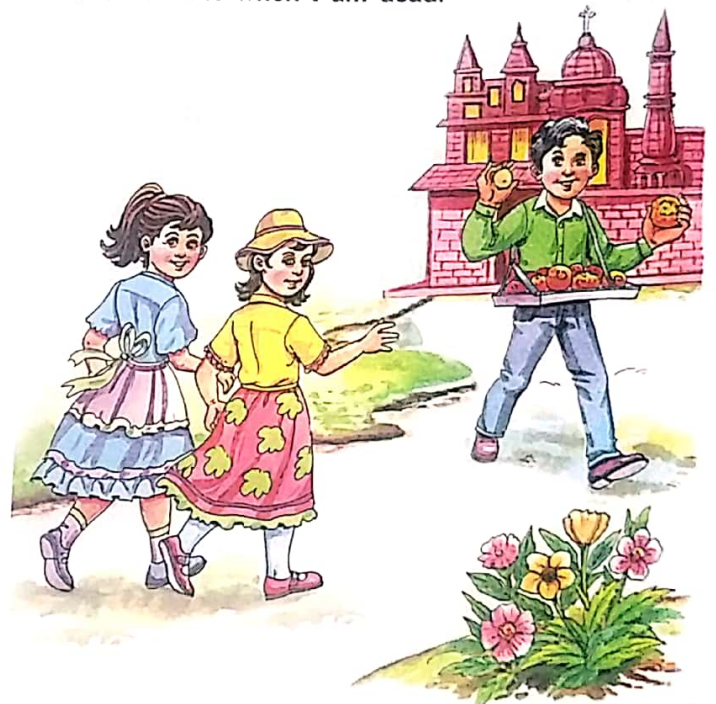
OPEN THEM SHUT THEM
